Abraham Sudderth's father, William Sudderth II, and his grandfather, James Sudderth, migrated from Albermarle Co., Va. into Burke Co. where his grandfather owned some 3,000 acres of land. William Sudderth II migrated into Gwinett Co., Ga. where Abraham was born.

Temperance Harris Sudderth, her husband and four small children (under seven), her brother David Harris, their mother, Rebecca Gilbert Harris, maiden sister, Dicy and other members of the family were migrating to Texas in 1853 when Temperance became ill, died and was buried in the Mississippi River bottom. It took three months to make the trip by ox wagons. James Gilbert Harris, another brother came in 1852 and blazed the way for the rest of the family. Temperance's mother and sister helped to take care of the four small children. The youngest was only three months old. They all settled in Wood Co., Tex. in the same neighborhood. Wood Co. was formed in 1850 from Van Zandt. They were pioneers of Wood Co.

One of the girls died before she was a year old. As a girl in my early teens, I remember that Gilbert (called Gil) Sudderth, one of Dave Sudderth's sons was running for Tax Assessor-Collector. Most of the sons of David Gilbert Sudderth and Martha Hancock Sudderth settled in Fannin Co., Tex. All farmers and have well improved farms. A grandson of David Sudderth and the writer visited the Sudderths all over the county in May 1961. About every other mail box through the country had Sudderth on it. David Sudderth, Martha Hancock Sudderth, and dau. Tempie are buried in the cemetery at Leonard, Tex. Markers at graves.

Abraham Sudderth, David Sudderth's father, and his second wife are buried in the Grove Hill Cemetery just North of Leonard, Tex.

Evidently, no markers were ever placed in the cemetery at Oak Grove. Judge Harris placed markers in the family lot at the Quitman Cemetery for them.

James Gilbert Harris and his brother, David Harris, blazed the way to Tex. in 1852 for the Harris Family, not long after their father had died in Gwinnett Co., Ga. They settled on the "Old Warlick" place between Quitman and Oak Grove. It is thought that David went back to Ga. the following year to bring his mother and sister, Dicy, to Tex. Several other Harris and allied families decided to make the move to Tex. with them. Temperance Harris Sudderth, a sister of James Gilbert and David, was taken ill on the trip, died, and is buried in the Mississippi River bottom.

James Gilbert Harris was born either in Burke or Buncombe Co., N.C. They were living in Buncombe Co. when the 1830 Census was taken. They had sold their land in Burke Co. Dec. 1824 and the writer presumes they migrated into Buncombe come Spring. If this is correct, James Gilbert was the only one of the boys not born in Burke Co. Another girl was b. in Buncombe in 1934. Her name was Carita. She probably was married in Gwinnett Co. shortly before the family left for Tex. Somehow nothing was ever known about this girl. If she was not a sister, she could have been a niece of David's and was living in their home at the time the 1840 and 1850 Census was taken.

Susannah (Susan) Willson Harris was b. in Greene Co., Tenn. the daughter of Hugh Willson b. in Botetourt Co., Va. His father, Hugh Willson, was in Botetourt Co., Va. as early as 1774. Susannah Willson migrated into Texas with her father, brothers and a married sister ca. 1845. They came by flat boat most of the way. First into the Tennessee River then the Ohio, the Mississippi River, and then into the Red. Presume that they embarked near Shreveport and made the trip the rest of the way by wagons drawn by oxen. They settled in that part which was old Nacogdoches Co. Van Zandt Co. was organized in 1848. This found Hugh Willson and his family in Van Zandt Co. In 1850 Wood Co. was formed from Van Zandt. Then the Hugh Willson's were

in Wood Co. The writer found them in the Van Zandt Census of 1850. Wood was not formed until late in the year. Some of the earliest settlers in that part of the country were George Greer, Henry Stout, P. M. Gunstream, Hugh Willson, Bentons, etc. Some of the earliest settlers in Wood Co., subsequent to its organization and before the Civil War, were the Harts, Butlers, Douglasses, Shoemakers, Flournoys. The Harrises, Sudderths, Bagbys, Ingrams, Willsons, Bentons are all Harris and allied families from 1846 to 1853.

This was the second class to graduate in Law at the University of Texas. T. W. Gregory, a great Benefactor of the University, and for whom the Gregory Gymnasium is named, was a member of this class with Virgil Byron Harris.

Judge Harris and his wife spent most of their married life at Quitman, Tex. the county seat of Wood Co., where he practiced Law. He filled several important offices in the county and district, among which was County Judge and District Judge.

Judge Harris took a great interest in the "Old Settlers" reunion of Wood Co. He served many years as President of the Organization and was instrumental in getting the first home where Governor Stephen Hogg lived after their marriage moved to the Park at Quitman. Governor Stephen Hogg lived near Virgil Byron Harris and his brother James David Harris when they were young.

## A TRADITIONAL STORY OF FACTS

given by

Mrs. Martha Ann Moss (nee Gilliam, Harris.)

I, Martha Ann Gilliam Moss of Pine, Camp Co., Texas, testify to the facts herein stated, to the best of my ability, knowledge and belief to be the truth concerning my ancestors and also of Mrs. E. L. Richardson of Lawton, Okla.

That my great grandfather Edward Harriss of Burke Co., N.C. was born about the year 1738 (note--should have been 1748) had two older brothers, one David Harriss b. ca.1733 (note--should have been ca. 1746) and Miniard Harris b. about 1736 (note--should have been 1742).

David Harris's wife's name was Nannie Lane; Miniard's wife's name was Sally (Sarah) Johnson and Edward Harris's wife's name was Mary (Molly or Polly) Johnson. Those two brothers married sisters.

David Harris had several children, one I know to be Braddock Harris. Miniard Harris had several children but I only know one. His name was Edward Harris.

And it is known to me by all records of hearing my grandmother, who was a daughter of Edward Harriss(note--Mavin) and a niece of David and Miniard, that those three brothers were soldiers of the Revolutionary War of the United States and that said Miniard Harris was killed at the Battle of "King's Mountain" Oct. 7, 1780 and his children were cared for after the war by his brothers. His son Edward was about the age of my grandmother Mavan Harris Gilliam and he was called "Mountain Ned" to distinguishhim from all other Neds in the family. Edward being a family name of the Harriss family.

And to the best of my memory, said Edward Harriss was born about the year of 1786 Note--definitely wrong as he was born before 1780 ca.1776). His wife's name was Betsy Harriss (note--she was his uncle Edward's dau.) and they had a son named Edward. This branch of the family migrated into Georgia and some to Tenn., but I have kept in touch with the descendants of said brothers of the Harriss Family and by Mrs. E. L. Richardson being closely related to members of the Harriss Family that I know descended from those three brothers. I trace her Revolutionary ancestor to be Miniard Harris, killed at Battle of King's Mountain, S.C., Oct. 7, 1780.

Furthermore, I wish to state, I am a Great Granddaughter and Great Niece of those three brothers and am a descendant of Edward Harris on both my mother's and father's side. And furthermore my first husband, Carroll Harriss was of line of my gr. Grandfather, Johnson Harriss (note--Johnson was a son of Edward Harris of Revolution). I am the oldest living member of the Harriss Family that I know to be living and am making this statement of my own free will and pleasure.

Edward Harriss and his brothers, Miniard and David Harriss were in the Revolutionary War. They fought in the Battle of King's Mountain, where Miniard and David were both killed. Edward returned to tell of seeing Miniard fall in battle, but could not identify him later. There are no records in Washington to substantiate this, but it has been handed down in the respective families. It is presumed they were in a fast gathering Militia on way to King's Mountain with neighbors who joined in the affray. It is said that farmers and woodsmen swarmed in to help in this battle. Records were poorly kept, many times just names and no places of residence were recorded. Many records were so dirty and mutilated that it was impossible to record them properly.

There were eight known children of Edward Harriss(2) but the order of birth is not known.
