They lived in adjoining counties. I can remember hearing my mother b. 1869 say they used to go to Rains Co. to visit Aunt Fan Sanford when she was a little girl.

A few traditional stories and a bit of evidence available about the other children of Miniard Harris and Sarah Johnson Harris.

- (3) Miniard Harris b. ca. 1767 presumably migrated into S.C. with his Uncles Braddock and Edward ca. 1798 or before. A Mainyard Harris was found on 1800 Census of Laurens Co., S.C.
- (3) Elizabeth called Betsy Harris b. 1770, d. 1845 in Georgia, m. Moses Sanders in Wilkes Co. about 1788. She, evidently, was in Stephens' home in Wilkes Co., as he was a witness and bondsman for her. "Tradition" says, "that the brothers of Miniard helped Sarah with her family after the death of Miniard at Battle of King's Mountain, Oct. 7, 1780." Betsy Harris Sanders and Moses Sanders migrated into South Carolina along with Stephen and his family about 1789. They were found in the 1790 Census of Laurens Co., S.C. Betsy Harris Sanders and Moses Sanders had one son when the Census, 1790, was taken. His name was "Miniard." The writer has found out through correspondence that Betsy least two more children and their names were "Harris" and "Sarah". To and Moses Sanders died in Ga. Betsy in 1845.
- (3) Two daughters in the 1790 Census of Burke Co. Their names probably Mary and Sarah, a dau. living with Sarah in 1800 Census - a widow- had son under 10.
- (3) John Harris- a short sketch of this family later.
- (3) Giles Harris- no proof. The writer found a Giles Harris in the 1850 Census of Burke Co. He could have been a son of this Giles, John, Edward or Miniard, sons of Miniard and Sarah.

Another name that turned up in the 1850 Census that hit me very forcibly was the family of Jonathan Gilbert. His wife's name was Mary (could have been one of Sarah's and Miniard's granddaughters). The names of their children is proof positive (I think) that they were closely related to Miniard and Sarah Harris. They had a son named "Miniard" and next child listed was "Sarah." Who they are and their descendants I presume is a closed book.

My dear Sir:

I am writing this letter to satisfy my mother who is now eighty-eight years old.

Her oldest sister who would now be 90 years if still living, married a John Henry, who lived near Waynesville, N.C. He, if living would be about ninety-three years old. My mother's sister's name was Mary, but I think they called her Polly. Her oldest child's name was Sophia Evoline Henry. I think John Henry had a brother by name of Bill Henry. Mary was a Harris before she married. Her oldest child was about two years old when my mother was separated from them. (Note: Evidently referring to the last time my Grandmother "Mary Henry" saw any of her Harris Family.-Homer Henry) (Note: Mary Henry d. 1915)

She has not heard from them in sixty or seventy years. Mother is the only one living out of the Harris Family that we know. Her brother's names were Jack and Ben and Miniard. Her father was also named "Miniard". (Note: This mistake in my grandfather's name caused me several years of research before I found that his name was Edward.-Key).

If you know anything about this John Henry Family, please write to me to satisfy my mother whose name is Evoline.

(The John Henry addressed in this letter was the son of John A. and Mary Elizabeth Harris Henry. -Homer Henry, a grandson of Mary E. Harris Henry and John A. Henry (Key).

A LETTER TO MRS. MAUDE HARRIS RICHARDSON OF LAWTON, OKLA.

Born 1844.

Dated 1929 Eton, Ga.

Dear unknown cousin:

I received your letter a few days ago wanting to know about the "Harris Family".

I am the only one in this country now that remembers ever seeing them as they all moved West long before the Civil War.

I am the daughter of Miniard Harris (note: son of John Harris, brother of David-Key). Ned Harris was a cousin of my father. He was either a first cousin or second cousin, I do not know which. (note: they were first cousins-Key). Ned's wife's maiden name was Estes. I think it is the same family, some spelled it Eastus. I think one of my father's sisters married an Estes. (note: Sarah Harris, dau. of John Harris, David's brother, m. James Estes the son of Larkin Estes who was a brother of Lott Estes that married Lora Gilbert. -Key) They lived in Burke Co., N.C. (note: many descendants living there and in Caldwell Co today. -Key) (note: Edward was son of Lewis. -Key)

Ned and Lora had a large family of children. One daughter lived in Haywood Co., N.C. Her husband's name was John Henry. I remember Lora going with us to "Haywood Co. to see her daughter. My mother's sister was living not far from her daughter. Your grandfather had two brothers named Jack and Ben. I think they went to Wood Co., Tex. He had one sister named Eveline that married a "Robins and one married an O'Rear. Two younger sisters Rhoda (Fannie) Sanford and Betty Anne Harris are younger than I am. Maybe still living. (note: No-Key My father used to hear from them after they left here but that was a long time ag" I think the last time he heard was after your great-grandfather's death.

My grandfather was not David Harris. There was a David Harris. He and his family went to Texas, the first of the family that went to Texas. (Note: James Gilbert and David came to Texas in 1852.-Key) He had a brother (note: Two brothers- Miniard and Giles.-Key) that lived here and David visited here after he went to Texas. (note: This letter indicated to the writer that David went back in 1853 to bring his mother and maiden sister back to Texas and James Gilbert stayed in Texas to get a crop harvested.-Key)

My father and one brother and another brother's family went to Texas before the Civil War. (This was John Harris and evidently the widow (Mary) of Silas and her five daughters.-Key) but I never hear from them. I am the only one of my father's family living. I had only one sister and one brother. I will be eighty-five years old in Nov. One of my sons lives with me and I have lived at the same place fifty-six years. My children all live near me except my youngest girl that lives at Memphis, Tex. She visited me last summer.

I was about to forget to tell you that I did not know Ned's name was Edward, as I never heard him called by any name except "Ned". He was a good looking man.

He had such black eyes. So was your grandfather a good looking man. He married a Turner. She had a sister named Siller. Her mother was a widow. Don't know whether she had any more children or not.

If you ever come to Ga. I would be glad to see you. Your letter reminded me of those I had not thought of for years. Write.

JOHN HARRIS, also signed by DAVID HARRIS to Langston Estes, both of Burke County, N.C. for \$400.00, two hundred acres on John's River where John Harris and David Harris now live, adjoining lands of said Estes, also another tract of 100 acres, granted to said John Harris and David Harris in 1819.

DATED, DEC. 27, 1824 DEED BOOK, PAGE 130

DAVID HARRIS, also signed by JOHN HARRIS, to Len Estes, Jr., both of Burke Co., N.C. for \$350.00, one hundred and twenty acres on John's River adjoining Edward Harris old line; WITNESS: Reid Hight, Robert Edmiston, Langston Estes

DATED, AUG. 1834 DEED BOOK #3, PAGE 293 JOHN HARRIS of Buncombe Co., N.C. to Len Estes, Jr., of Burke Co., N.C. for \$20.00, fifty acres on Betty Lance Branch of John's River, adjoining Edward Harris, old line and the lands of said Estes.

Total: Three hundred and seventy acres. No deeds when bought except the 100 acres land grant. Many of the Burke Co. Records were destroyed by fire duringthe War between the North and South 1861-5.

(3) John Harris b. 1774, d. 1839(ca), son of Miniard Harris and Sarah Johnson Harris, m. Dicy Harris, his cousin, the daughter of Miniard Harris's brother Edward Harris. They were married in Burke Co. cal800. The 1820 Census Report of Burke Co. lists four sons and three daughters.

The writer has a brief record of four of these children: (4) Miniard Harris b. 1812, son of John and Dicy Harris, m. Dicy Daughtery in Ga. Miniard Harris moved into Buncombe Co. ca. 1825 with his father and mother, John and Dicy Harris. The father John Harris died in Buncombe Co., N.C. The family migrated into Ga. before the 1840 Census was taken, Murray Co. Think this is the Miniard Harris that the father of Mary Catherine Griffin of Tunnel Hill, Ga. is a descendant. Her mother was also a descendant of a Miniard Harris, but he descended from David Harris, the brother of John Harris. The two Miniards were first cousins and had nicknames of "Hawkie" and "Bogey." It was not unusual to find a Miniard in every Harris family at that period.

- (4) Miniard Harris and Dicy Daughtery Harris's children were: (5) Martha Ann Harris, (5) Barbara Elizabeth Harris, (5) James Daughtery Harris.
- (5) Martha Ann Harris, dau. of Miniard Harris and Dicy Daughtery Harris b. Nov. 1844, m. James Loughridge, Murray Co., Ga. Their children: twins (6) James and Eunice Loughridge.
- (6) Eunice Loughridge, dau. of Martha Ann Harris Loughridge and James Loughridge, m. Lee Thornton. Their address was 1022 W. Main St., Memphis, Tex. Do not know whether they have any descendants there or not.
- $\mathbb{V}(4)$ John Harris b. 1817 son of John Harris and Dicy Harris, m. Salina ? b. 1827. They lived in Murray Co., Ga. Their children are: (5) John Harris b. 1843,
 - (5) Mary Harris b. 1845, (5) Jordan Harris b. 1849. The writer thinks that the above John Harris and Jordan Harris migrated to Wood Co., Tex. in early 1860's and would be about third cousins of my father, James David Harris. The family was listed in the 1850 Census of Murray Co. Could be possible the entire family migrated to Tex. about 1859, as many Harris families were coming to Texas about that time.
- (4) Sarah Harris b. 1813 in N.C. (was named for her grandmother, Sarah Johnson Harris), dau. of John and Dicy Harris, m. James Estes b. 1809, d. 1886. His mother was Clarrissa Gilbert, a sister of Rebecca Gilbert, who married David Harris. She was also a sister of Lora Gilbert, who married Lott Estes. The Estes, the Gilbert's, and Harris families were all neighbors along the John's River, near where Collettsville, N.C. now stands. There were several marriages back and forth in these families. The writer is much mixed up with them.
 - (4) Silas Harris b. 1815, son of John Harris and Dicy Harris, m. Mary? had five girls. Lived in Ga. Martha Loughridge in her letter to Maude Harris Richardson of Lawton, says her father had a brother and family and another brother's family that migrated to Texas before the Civil War. This is the Mary Harris that lived in Wood Co. and the writers gr. uncle married 2nd to one of these girls. Both families settled in Wood Co. Silas possibly died in Ga. -75-

Miniard Harris, his father, sold his plantation in Va., Charlotte Co. in Feb. 1775. It is presumed that Miniard Harris and family, Edward Harris and family, David Harris and his family and perhaps Braddock Harris, migrated into N.C. at this time. They were in Rowan Co. until 1777 when Burke was taken from Rowan Co. Later in the year Wilkes was taken from part of Burke and Surry Cos. The male population of Burke Co. was said to be about 50 in 1777. Families lived near each other along creeks and rivers. After the new Cos. were formed in 1777, it found part of the Harris Family in Burke and part in Wilkes. David Harris was an infant at time his father was killed in Battle of King's Mountain, Oct. 7, 1780. His mother, Sarah Johnson Harris, was left with a big family of children. It is said by some of the Edward Harris line that the different brothers of Miniard helped her with the children.

Rebecca Gilbert was the daughter of Michael Gilbert. She was born in Lincoln Co., N.C. One of the last three born in Lincoln Co. The other six children were born in Va., Bedford Co. They were in the 1790 Census in Lincoln Co., but soon afterward moved into Burke Co. The Gilbert, the Estes, and the Harris families were all neighbors in Burke Co. along the John's River not far from where Collettsville is now located. The Harris's married Gilbert's and Estes's. The Gilberts married Estes's. This part of Burke Co. is now Caldwell Co.

David Harris and Rebecca Gilbert Harris lived in Burke Co., N.C. until after 1824. This was the year that David and John Harris sold their plantation. They

were in the 1830 Census of Buncombe Co. An uncle of the writer, Judge V. B. Harris left a short sketch of this family with his personal papers. He said all of the children were born in Burke Co. His father, James Gilbert, was not born until 1827. The youngest child, Carita, was born in Buncombe Co., as they were there by 1830. They probably migrated into Buncombe Co. by 1825. If so, James Gilbert was the only son born in Buncombe Co. in 1827. Before the 1840 Census was taken, David and his family had migrated into Ga., Gwinnett Co. David's name did not appear on the 1850 Census of Gwinnett Co. but the names of his children (those still unmarried) and Rebecca, his wife, were listed on the 1850 Census. In 1852 James Gilbert Harris and David Harris, the two sons unmarried migrated to Tex. They settled in Wood Co. The next year, David went back to Ga., 1853, brought his mother, Rebecca, and a maiden sister, Dicy, back to Tex. with him and at the same time several other members of the family formed a wagon train and all came together. They were among the pioneers of Wood Co. The county was not formed until 1850 late in the year. Carita, the youngest child, did not make the trip to Texas; presumed that she married and remained in Ga. Nothing is known about her.

There is a chart of this Harris family on the preceding page.

- [4] Rebecca Harris b. 1812, dau. of David and Rebecca Harris, m. Henry Ingram. I have no records of this family, but as a small child, I do remember Aunt Becky Ingram. Her big rug-making loom was something for me to watch and I was reared on a couple of rugs that came from her loom. The married names of her daughters were Mrs. John Williams, Mrs. Bill Gordon, Mrs. Tom Jackson, Mrs. Mary Brown, Mrs. Eleanor Winkle. The writer remembers Thomas Winkle, the son of Eleanor Winkle b. the same year that my father was born. His son, Harmon, and a brother still live in the Oak Grove community of Wood Co. I also remember Fannie Jackson Caldwell quite well. The Jackson family came to Texas in 1858 from Ga.
- (4) Miniard Harris b. Mar. 27, 1814, d. Nov. 1880. He was the son of David Harris and Rebecca Gilbert Harris. He married Martha Matilda Holland b. ca. 1841. She was b. in South Carolina. Miniard Harris migrated to Ga. with his parents, brothers and sisters sometime between 1835 and 1840. He was on the 1840 Census with his father but soon thereafter he went into Cherokee Co., Ga., where he helped to move the Indians therefrom. He was a pioneer of that Co. Where he helped to move the Indians therefrom. He was a pioneer of that Co. He married there and later made permanent settlement in Murray Co., Ga. They lived near Springplace on a farm. Springplace at that time was the county seat of Murray Co. He was called to fill several responsible positions there, among which were the office of Tax Collector and Treasurer.

Miniard Harris and Martha Matilda Holland Harris reared a large family. Three girls and eight boys were b. to this union. One of the sons died in infancy. Three of the sons became Doctors; two were Medical Doctors and one a Dentist, and one son was a Pharmacist. Three sons became lawyers and one a teacher.
